“Blue Nights” is a scientific project founding by SEA-EU Alliance UBO. It focuses on the impact of light pollution, specifically in touristic areas. Analyses and comparison will be produced between Britany (France), Cadiz (Spain) and Malta.

The Blue Nights teams set of common criteria for the comparison of six territories (two per country) and started the analysis crossing with light pollution via satellite images also.
